Disclaimer: Lise says that it might not be a good idea to have crystals in the window. If the sun hits it, it could act like a prism and may be set something on fire. Tatted Angel on left, Angel from previous report in middle, bobbin lace kit from Germany on right.

You can find real crystals from old chandeliers in antique shops in different sizes. Or you can buy inexpensive ones in home-improvement shops like Lowe's. This is one of those. Use the metal fastener to hold the lace in place.

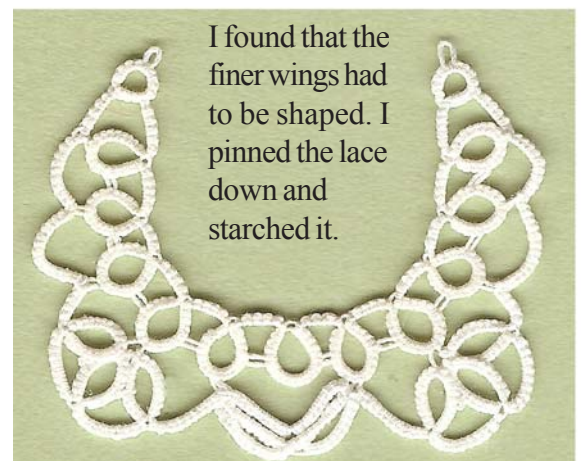

Crystal Angel with finer wings



Pull shuttle thread through bottom of beginning ring.
Make square knot and work ends away or dab some Elmer's glue on and cut threads off when dry.

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I was not pleased with the look of the "arms", so I changed the two split rings to this:

ch10 - ch10 attach to picot of ring scipping the one without turn and go back ch10 + ch10 attach
turn again ch10 + ch10 attach

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Is this in improvement? With picots and praying hands?
Done with 100 % cotton Flora # 20

Can you come up with another version?
