



Ringtrim – a microdragon

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Meet Ringtrim, a micro dragon. He exists for you to practice your tatting rings, as his name is Norwegian for exercising rings.

This pattern is free and must not be sold, but share this file for free all you want.

You need

Two shuttles and a suitable thread of two colours.

You need to know how to make split rings (SR) and single shuttle split rings (SSSR). For the SSSR the technique described by Mathew Takeda is used. See <http://www.paradisetreasures.com/takedassr.pdf>

Ringtrim may, if you insist, be made in a single colour. If so, you can replace the SSSRs with SRs. He is however more happy in two colours.

Symbols

R	Ring
C	Chain (don't need those)
SR	Split ring, the two halves are separated by /
SSSR	Single shuttle split ring
numbers	The number of double stitches (dst)
p	Picot
3-3	3 dst, picot, 3 dst
--	Long picot
----	Even longer picot
&	Twisted picot

Pattern

Start with the shuttle containing the thread that will colour the tail, back and wings.

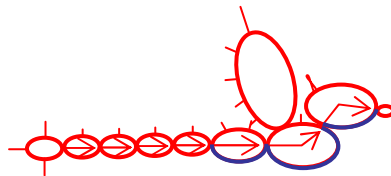
R: 2--2--2--2.

SSSR: 2-2/4.

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SR: 2-2-2/6. Make the second part of the SR using the second shuttle and the second colour
Reverse work

SR: 3--3--4/2(R: 2--2--2--2--2--2----12)2-2. Start the SR using the second shuttle

Reverse work

SR: 4&5/5. Start the SR using the first shuttle.

R: 4. Use the first shuttle.

Tie, hide and cut treads. Moisture the dragon and flatten him on a towel at the same time as you shape the tail according to the mood (the mood of the dragon that is, not yours ☺)
