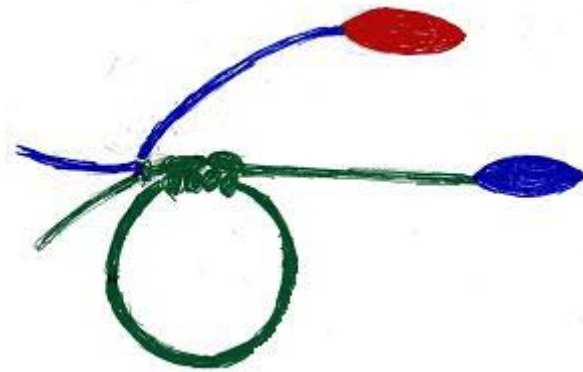


## The Daisy picot technique

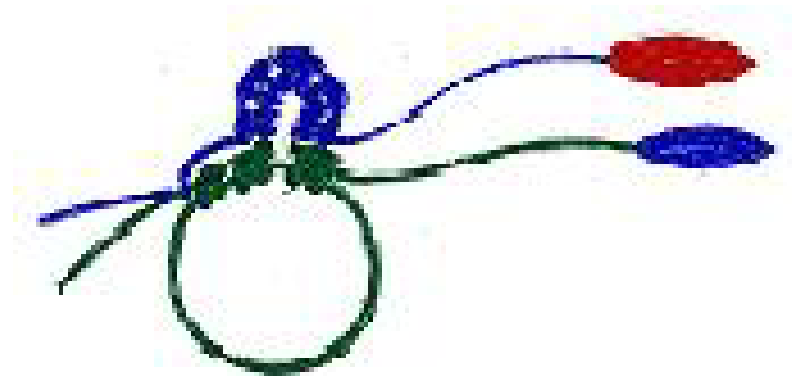
I learned this technique from the Shuttle brothers and Mark Myers.



Picture 1  
2 normal ds



Picture 2  
4 daisy ds (dds)



Picture 3 2 ds, 4 dds, 1ds.

### Abbreviations:

R = Ring

Ch = chain

ds = double stitch

dds = daisy double stitch

RW = reverse work

cl = close ring

For the daisy picot you need two shuttles with 2 different colors.

The thread goes over your left hand and you start a ring with the green thread, see Picture 1. After 2 ds let the green thread just hang down and take the blue thread and make a ds on the ring, but take care, don't let them flip and you tat in the normal way; first half, second half, see Picture 2.

After some stitches, lay the blue back over your left hand and take the green and tat again 2 ds, see Picture 3.

Now you have a picot with knots on it.

What you do is making a chain as your picot, so all you can do on a chain you can do here. Try it!
