



2-shuttle ring (2-shR)


1. Pop shuttle thread over the fingers as for tatting a ring.



2. Pop the same thread over the fingers for the 2nd time and fix somehow.




3. Using direct stitch order wrapping (see [Instructions for direct stitch order wrapping](#)) wrap the 2nd shuttle thread round both parts of thread from the 1st shuttle.




What elements can be made while tatting 2-shR?

1. Ring.
2. Daisy picot. In comparison with daisy picot made on the ordinary ring, here there is no part of thread that comes from the previous element and lies above ring's knots.



3. Maltese ring. It comes out when you begin 2-shR with wrapping, then put a shuttle with which you made wrapping aside and tat several knots like in ordinary ring using the other shuttle, and further alternate wrapping and tatting.

4. To make a description complete it should be mentioned that it is also possible to tat parts of 2-shR as an ordinary chain. The result is shown in the photo together with one of possible implementations – beads sequence, located in the middle of the 2-shR transversally.
