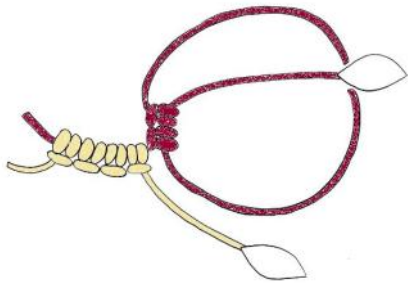


Maltese ring. 4 variants.

In Maltese ring knots that are tatted like in ordinary ring alternate with knots that are wrapped using different kinds of wrapping. On the wrapped parts we can tat rings.

In the chart the 1st and the 3rd steps are the same for all variants.

1. Begin to tat ring.



2.1. Use reverse stitch order wrapping round the core thread of the ring.



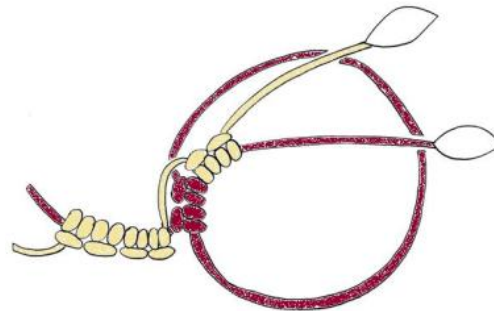
3. Continue tatting ring.



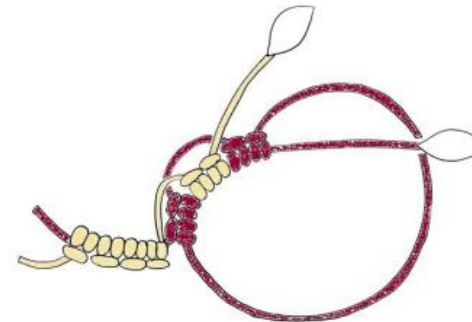

2.2. Use direct stitch order wrapping round the core thread of the ring OR ordinary tating.



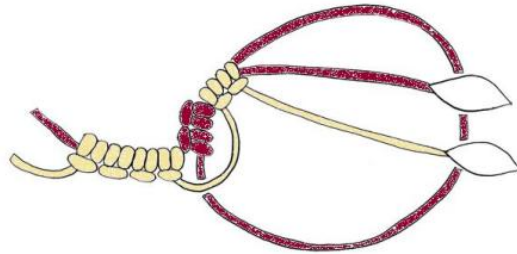

2.3. Use reverse stitch order wrapping round both core thread and working thread of the ring.



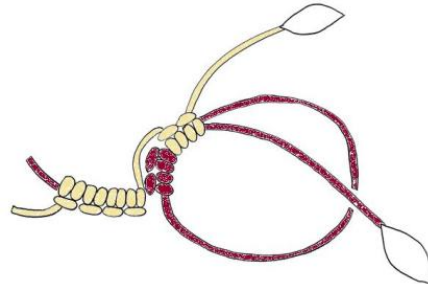

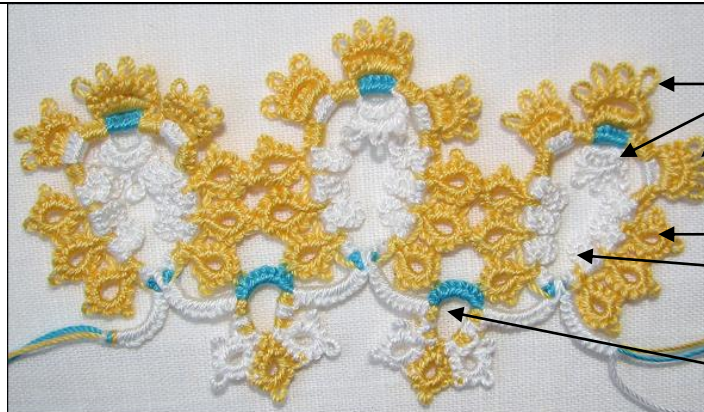

3-shuttle Maltese ring.

Using 3 shuttles we can design plenty different combinations of tatted and wrapped parts of the Maltese ring. Example is in the photo. Blue thread is a core thread of the Maltese rings.



Half moon single shuttle split rings instead of picots

Rings on the outer side of Maltese ring
Josephine rings on the inner side

3-shuttle split ring with 2nd half made as Maltese ring
