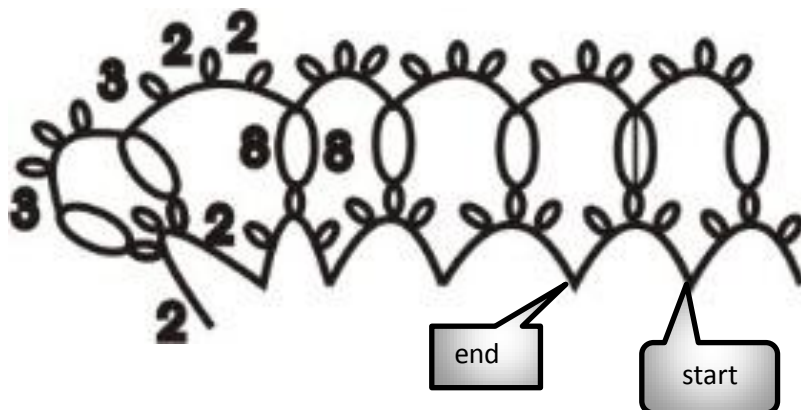


# TENERIFE AND TATTING

## ABBREVIATIONS

- CH - chain
- SCH - split chain
- R - ring
- SR - split ring.
- - picot
- + - join
- CTM - continuous thread method
- MP - mock picot
- CLr - close ring

## TATTING

### 1° ROUND

CTM in any arc of Tenerife.

1° CH = 2DS – 2DS – 2DS – 2DS + next arc of Tenerife 2DS – 2DS – 2DS – 2DS + next arc of Tenerife.

In corner join 2x in same arc. Doing all around Tenerife.

In the last arc = 2DS – 2DS (SCH 2DS – 2DS ) MP.

### 2° ROUND

SR = 8DS /8DS CLr.

CH = 3DS – 2DS – 2DS – 3DS

R = 8DS – 8DS CLr. + 2° picot of the chain from previous row.

In corner

R = 8DS – 8DS CLr. + 1<sup>o</sup> picot of the chain from previous row.

CH = 3DS – 2DS – 2DS – 3DS.

R = 8DS – 8DS CLr. + 3<sup>o</sup> picot of the chain from previous row.

Doing all around.

Tie and Cut.

## **TENERIFE**

Make the plot in a loom 9cm (3.5 ") with 40 nails.

Here's an example of how to compose a loom.

Make 3 laps interspersed the threads, one above and one below.

Make a flower with 4 petals using 4 threads of plot, and 4 petals (the corners) with 5 threads.

### **Petals**

Make 15 laps with 5 threads interspersing the threads, one above and one below. Complete the petals with 3 laps using 3 threads of plot. . 8x

### **Finish**

Take a pair of thread each nail and tie a knot. Tie knots all around.

Repeat the process by making a knot in the line between the threads of each nail and a knot in the cord itself, forming an inverted V.

Make a knot between the two thread of each nail leaving a gap in the thread not to pucker the job. Do all around.

Cut the wire and pass to glue cloth, for not untie.
