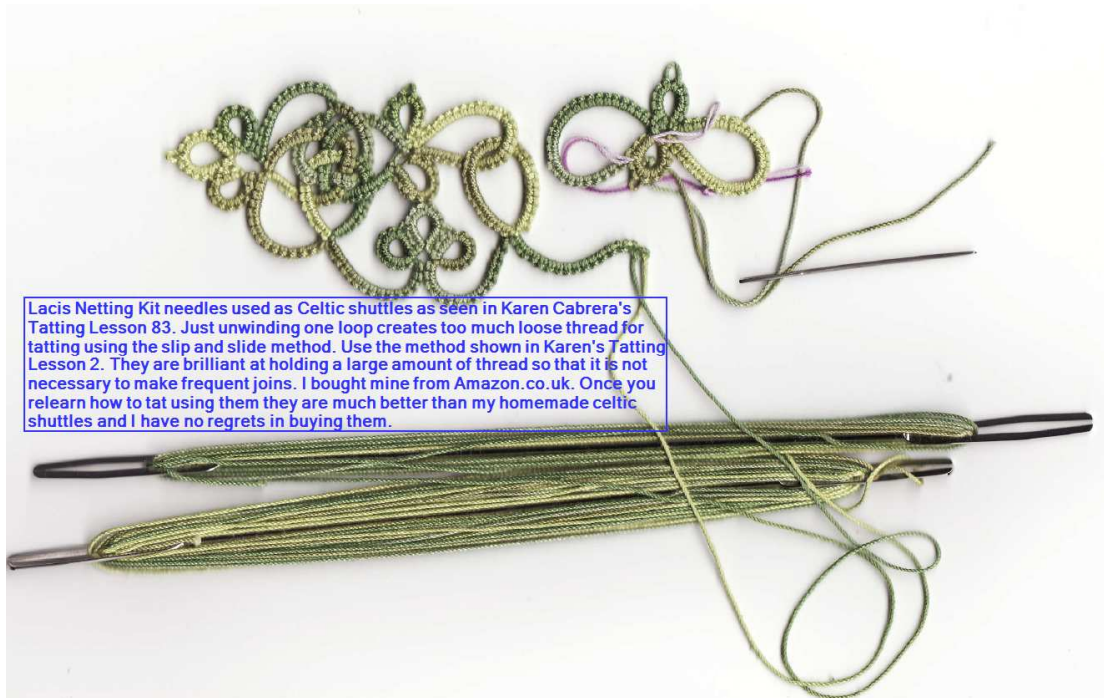

Lacis Netting Kit needles used as Celtic shuttles as seen in Karen Cabrera's Tatting Lesson 83. Just unwinding one loop creates too much loose thread for tatting using the slip and slide method. Use the method shown in Karen's Tatting Lesson 2. They are brilliant at holding a large amount of thread so that it is not necessary to make frequent joins. I bought mine from Amazon.co.uk. Once you relearn how to tat using them they are much better than my homemade celtic shuttles and I have no regrets in buying them.

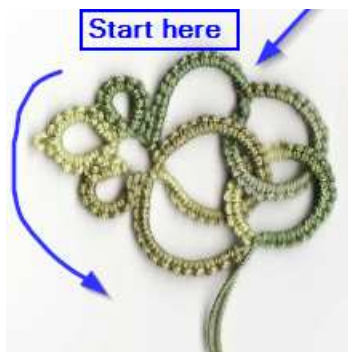

Stages of the pattern

1. This was just my idea to tat a chain instead of leaving long threads to tat the final ring. I wasn't very confident about tating the Celtic rings to start with. If I ever try this pattern again I shall go for it and tat all the Celtic rings!
