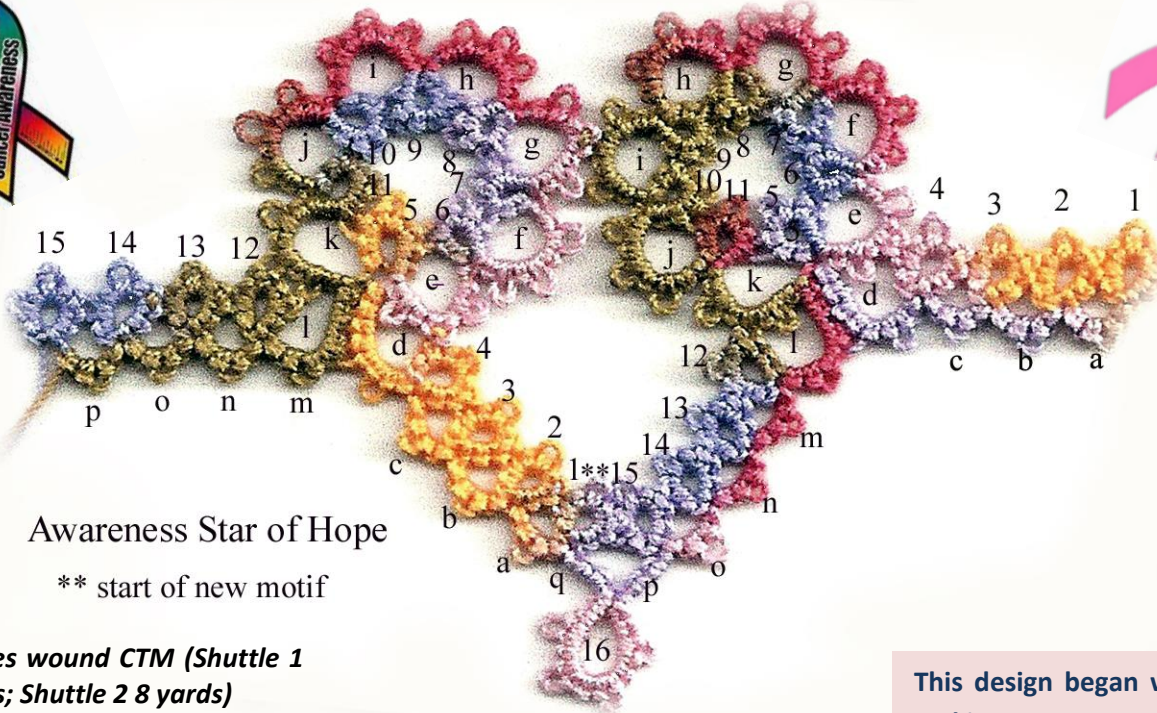


AWARENESS STAR OF HOPE

Awareness Star of Hope

** start of new motif

**Two shuttles wound CTM (Shuttle 1
10 yards; Shuttle 2 8 yards)**

R1 2-2-2-2 RW

Ca 2-2 RW

R2 2+(R1)2-2-2 RW

Cb 2-2 RW

R3 2+(R2)2-2-2 RW

Cc 2-2 RW

R4 2+(R3)2-2-2 RW

Cd 2-2-2-2 **DNRW**

SS R5 2-2-2-2 RW

Ce 2-2+(last picot R4)2-2 RW

Begin Inner Ring Sequence:

* **R6** 2+(R5)1-1-2 RW

Cf 2-2-2-2 RW *

Repeat * to * additional 4 times (R 7 to R 10 in Diagram and Cg to Cj in diagram)

R11 2+(R10)2-2+(R5)2 RW

Ck 2-2-2-2 C L J (base of ring 5) RW

SS Cl 2+2+2-2 (joining to corresponding chain d) RW

R12 2+(center picot of chain k)2-2-2 RW

Cm 2-2 RW

R13 2+(R12)2-2-2 RW

Cn 2-2 RW

R14 2+(R13)2-2-2 RW

Co 2-2 RW

R15 2+(R14)2-2-2 **DNRW**

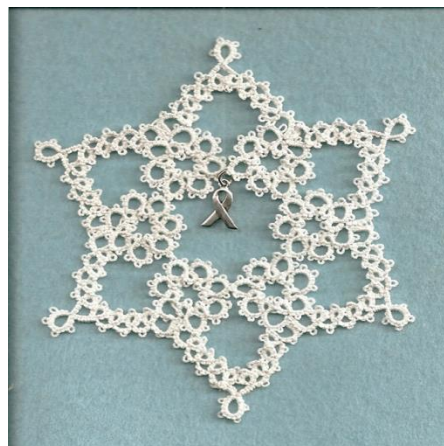
SS Cp 3 RW

R16 3-3-3-3-3 RW

Cq 3 **DNRW**

Start again with Ring 1 through Chain q until you have completed 6 center motifs and 6 outer points joining last Chain (Cq) to base of Ring 1 in first motif. You will join the first ring (R1) in motifs 2 through 6 to the last ring (R15) of the previous motif. You will also join Ring 15 of motif 6 to Ring 1 of the first motif prior to making your final Cp, R16, Cq sequence. Join center picot of Chain g of motifs 2 through 6 to center picot of Chain i of the previous motif and also be sure to join motif 6 to motif 1 at Chain g.



This design began with an idea of making a cancer awareness ribbon motif and did not quite turn out as envisioned. However, if you use your imagination, you will see an awareness ribbon within the internal ring sequence and at each point of the larger ribbon is a ring and chain sequence representing a smaller awareness ribbon. A very good friend suggested I call the motif an "Awareness Star of Hope," thus the design became a written pattern that I hope you will enjoy. In preparing a sample motif for the charting above, I decided the two motifs as shown could actually be prepared as a pin for a cancer survivor. I hope you will enjoy this Awareness Star of Hope!
