Tatted Camisole York

Pattern 37 motif
by Aurora Lozada

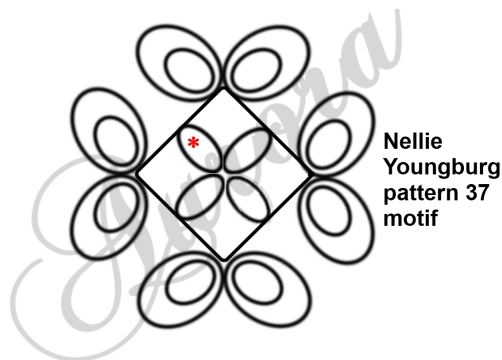
The tatted camile york is made of a main motif repeated eighteen times and an edging (pattern 14), for both borders. Motif pieces were joined by sewing and so it was the edging to the motifs.

The main motif is done with onion rings. An onion ring is a complex shape of 2 rings, one surrounded by another one and joined together to keep them in place.

Nellie Youngburg said "turn small ring into large ring and fasten securely by bringing shuttle thread through the two rings and passing through loop".

There are other known methods to join the rings of an onion ring.

I have my own method created on may 10, 2014, to make the onion ring keeping its position.

R4= 4DS +R2 7 (4DS -) vsp 4DS CR #pink

C2= 4DS +R4 8DS RW # pink

join to R4's vsp

R5= 4DS - 4DS +R0 - 4DS CR RW # white

C3= 8DS vsp 4DS # pink

Will form a onion ring

R6= 3 (4DS -) 4DS CR # pink

R7= 4DS +C3 8 (4DS -) 4DS CR # pink

Will form a onion ring

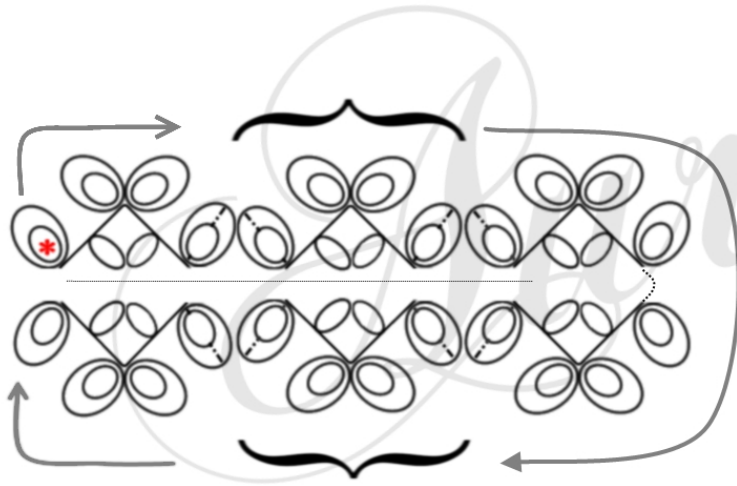
R8= 3 (4DS -) 4DS # pink

R9= 4DS +R7 7 (4DS -) vsp 4DS CR # pink

C4= 4DS +R9 8DS LJ R0 # pink

join to R9's vsp, to R0's base

Cut, tie and hide ends
